

Minutes
Fish and Royer Lake Association
General Meeting
August 14, 2010

1. Minutes of June 5 general meeting were approved.
2. Norine Doig presented the financial report. Income was \$392.05. There were four donations totaling \$70.00, 12 dues totaling @240.00. The 50/50 raffle brought in \$80.00. total income was \$4476.08. 99 households joined the association thus far. Twenty three pictures were sold, 2 @\$25.00, 21 @\$40.00, totaling \$890.00.
3. Bob Drach won the 50/50 raffle and turned in the proceeds as a donation at the June meeting.
4. Joe Albergo expressed thanks to the many people who donated time, food (Erik Pearson donated the hog and roasted it), tents, and tables.
5. A motion was made and seconded to stock the lake with walleye, as planned. The motion was approved.
6. It was reported that last year Erik Pearson and Dave Arrington donated smallmouth bass. Smallmouth will reproduce in our lakes. The cost to Erik and Dave was \$1080 for 750 smallmouth bass each 6-8" long. Thanks, Dave and Erik!
7. Gloria Peart donated scrubbers which were sold, and the proceeds donated. She will bring more
8. Other fundraisers include the cookbook. Pam Deetz collected the recipes brought by residents and will work on the cookbook. Other fund raising suggestions were lake pictures on coffee mugs, flags, wind socks, sales of more photographs.
9. Several members, including Joy Grose, Kathy Wirth, and Eleanor McBride volunteered to go door to door to increase membership in the association.
10. Brian Mervau presented proposals for a number of educational programs. Sign up sheets were passed around.
11. Ron and Marianne Lucas won the 50/50 raffle and donated the proceeds.
12. Jody and Jeff Greer won the picture raffle.
13. A concern was raised that 5 acres of undeveloped land on Royer Lake is being marketed for development by Real Living Homes and Beyond Realty. The realtor is Cynthia Hostetler, phone 260-463-2881. The address of the property is S 500 E Royer Lake. A wetland map showed that the shoreline for this property is all Palustrine-Forested Wetland, although some land is on higher ground. Leroy Meek 336-3185 of 2055 S. 445 E. Lagrange, IN 46761 stated that he and his neighbors had received letters from the Army Corps of Engineers telling them to call and report if one tree was felled on this land. Neil Ledet of the DNR had told Carol Massat that the area along the shoreline was the concern of the DNR. Anything further away from the lake that would affect the lake would be the concern of the Army Corps of Engineers. A committee was appointed to pursue the matter, consisting of Carol Massat, Dick Krull, Jim Baranek, and Joe Hilt.
14. The slate of officers was approved and elected, including Joe Albergo, President, Dick Krull, vice president, Norine Doig, treasurer, and Carol and Helmuth Massat, co-secretaries.
15. A good time was had by all!
